The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) received the attached letter dated November 19, 2013 from Ernest C. Brown of Smith, Currie & Hancock LLP on behalf of Flatiron Construction Corp. (Flatiron), protesting the bid submitted on aforementioned contract by Shimmick Construction Company, Inc. (Shimmick) on October 31, 2013. The protest alleges that Shimmick failed to provide complete information in Columns 1 through 4 within the time specified on the Subcontractor List form. Furthermore, did not give a description of work for their listed subcontractor R.J. Noble (Noble) on the Subcontractor List on the day bids were opened and changed the work description on the 24 hour submittal.

Caltrans conducted a review of the bid documents submitted by Shimmick and has determined that Shimmick, on its Subcontractor List submitted on bid day, did not provide a short term summary of the work to be performed, but instead listed the actual items of work (Bid Items 136-143) being subcontracted to Noble. However, on the 24 hour submission, Shimmick did list Noble to perform the same work, using the same bids item numbers and included a short termed description of the work. As such, the use of terminology in lieu of the bid items had no material effect on the scope of work to be performed by Noble.

Given the explanation provided above, Caltrans finds the bid submitted by Shimmick responsive and will proceed to award the contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, provided that all requirements have been met.

Flatiron hereby protests Shimmick's bid for Contract No. 12-0F96E4.

Shimmick failed to provide complete information in Columns 1 through 4 within the time specified on the Department's Subcontractor List form OES-OE-0102.2 (REV 3/2011) ("Subcontractor List"). Shimmick did not give a description of work for their listed subcontractor R.J. Noble on the Subcontractor List on the day bids were opened. Shimmick changed R.J. Noble's subcontracted work description on the subsequent Subcontractor List submitted within 24 hours of bid opening.

Flatiron requests that the Department find Shimmick's bid non-responsive because they failed to follow the instructions on the Subcontractor List and violated Public Contract Code Section 4104(b).

The Department's Subcontractor List has instructions and 4 columns to be filled out by the contractor; Columns 1 and 4 at bid time and 2 and 3 either with the bid or within 24 hours of the bid opening:

- Instructions: The bidder must identify each subcontractor performing work in an amount in excess of ½ of 1 percent of the total bid or \$10,000, whichever is greater (Pub cont Code § 4100 et seq.). Complete columns 1 and 4 and submit with the bid. Complete columns 2 and 3 and submit with the bid or fax to (916) 227-6282 within 24 hours after the bid opening. Failure to provide complete information in columns 1 through 4 within the time specified will result in a nonresponsive bid.
- Column 1: Business Name and Location (Public Contract Code 4104(a)(1))
- Column 2: Bid Item Nos. (Public Contract Code 4104(a)(2)(A))
- Column 3: Percentage of Bid Item Subcontracted (Public Contract Code 4104(a)(2)(A))
- Column 4: Description of Subcontracted Work (Public Contract Code 4104(b))


Shimmick failed to complete Column 4 for listed subcontractor R.J. Noble's work on the day of bid. Instead of describing R.J. Noble's work, Shimmick wrote "Item 136-143" which is not a work description.

The Subcontractor list clearly states that Column 2 is reserved for "Bid Item Numbers" and Column 4 is reserved for "Description of Subcontracted Work". Column 4 is consistent with Public Contract Code Section 4104(b). Therefore, Shimmick failed to follow the Subcontractor List instructions and violated the Public Contract Code.

Furthermore, Shimmick changed R.J. Noble's description of work in column 4 to "AC Dike / Asphalt Paving" on their second Subcontractor List submitted within 24 hours of the bid opening. Shimmick's bid-day subcontractor form improperly described R.J. Noble's work as "Item 136-143".

Flatiron requests that the Department deem Shimmick's bid non-responsive and award the contract to Flatiron who was the low, responsible, and responsive bidder.

Dear Mr. McMillan:

On behalf of Flatiron, I am submitting this letter regarding Contract No. 12-0F96E4 (the "Contract"). Flatiron maintains that they are the low, responsible, responsive bidder for the Contract as detailed in letters Flatiron sent the Department on November 4, 5, 12 and 15, 2013. Flatiron hereby requests again that the Department reconsider and reverse its November 13, 2013 decision and award the Contract to Flatiron.

A major reason for this concern is the fact the Department has recently determined this exact issue – in favor of the low, responsible bidder. The bids for Contract No. 03-3F0304 were opened on February 27, 2013 (the "Sierra Project"). After opening those bids, the Department found that Sierra Nevada Construction ("Sierra") was the low, responsible, responsive bidder even though Sierra added a new subcontractor and scope of work to the Subcontractor List form after the bids had been opened. The Department found the bid-day Subcontractor List was the controlling document.

The order of bid prices from lowest to highest on bid day was as follows: Sierra, Granite Construction Company ("Granite"), and then Teichert Construction.

Sierra listed the following subcontractors in this order on its day-of-bid Subcontractor List:

- Gerco Contractors
- Par Electrical Cont. Inc.
- Midstate Barrier
- ABSL Construction
- Construction Area Signs
- Penhall Co.

Sierra then revised its Subcontractor List and submitted it the next day, listing:

- ABSL
- Construction Area Signs
- Gerco Contractors, Inc
- Midstate Barrier, Inc
- PAR Electrical Contractors, Inc.
- Penhall Company
- Wells Sweeping

Sierra added Wells Sweeping to their subsequently submitted Subcontractor List with "Sweeping" as their scope of work.

I have attached the following Sierra Project-related documentation:

- 3/19/13 – Granite protested Sierra's bid regarding their DBE commitment values.
- 3/20/13 – The Department deemed Granite non-responsive for adding "Message Boards" to S.T. Rhoades on their 24-hour Subcontractor List even though S.T. Rhoades was listed on their day-of-bid submittal.
- 4/25/13 – The Department responded to Granite's protest stating that their protest lacked merit.
- 4/29/13 – The Department awarded to Sierra.

The Department conducted a thorough review of Sierra's bid and found it responsive. When it did so, the Department recognized that the addition of a new subcontractor and scope of work did not render the Sierra bid non-responsive.

In conclusion, Flatiron respectfully requests that the Department follow the long established precedent reflected in the Sierra Project and agree that Flatiron's bid was responsive.

It is not appropriate for the Department to take contradictory positions on separate projects.



Dear Mr. McMillan,

Granite Construction Company (Granite) hereby protests the potential award of the above referenced Contract to Sierra Nevada Construction (SNC). On February 27, 2013, SNC submitted the apparent low bid on this Contract. Granite submitted the second low bid, thus having standing for this protest.

With SNC's listed amounts on the "Caltrans Bidder - DBE - Commitment" form above that SNC purportedly met the DBE goal, discrepancies exist analyzing SNC's bid. As supported by the enclosed documentation, the inconsistencies in the following bid item prices versus DBE commitment values show that SNC inflated its DBE participation in the DBE Commitment Form.

SNC claims more DBE commitment value than referenced in the respective bid item prices, oversteering SNC's claimed DBE value by \$8,100. As a result, SNC failed to meet the DBE Goal of 4% for this Contract by 0.48%.

Due to the errors stated above, SNC's bid should be deemed non-responsive, and Granite should be declared the lowest responsive bidder and awarded the contract.

1. SNC Failed to Meet Contract DBE Goal

Since SNC's claimed DBE commitment should be reduced by the discrepancy between the commitment values and bid item prices, SNC failed to meet the Contract's DBE Goal by 0.48%. Granite submitted the lowest responsive bid on this project, meeting the DBE Goal.

Per the Contract's Specifications, bidders are required to "[t]ake necessary and reasonable steps to ensure that DBEs have the opportunity to participate in the contract." (See Standard Specification 2-1.12A). To this end, each bidder was required to meet the 8% Contract DBE goal or demonstrate that it made adequate good faith efforts to meet that goal.

II. Defects in SNC's Bid Are Material

California Public Contract Code §10180 requires the Department to award its construction contracts to the lowest responsive bidder via competitive bidding. "A basic rule of competitive bidding is that bids must conform with specifications, and that if a bid does not so conform, it may not be accepted." *Kovler Business Machines USA, Inc. v. Regents of University of California* (1988) 206 Cal. App. 3d 449, 454. "The purpose of requiring governmental entities to open the contracts process to public bidding is to eliminate favoritism, fraud and corruption; avoid misuse of public funds; and stimulate advantageous market place competition." (See legislative intent declared in the citations to Pub. Cont. Code, § 10300.)

A bid that does not strictly conform to the call for bids cannot be accepted if the variance could have affected the amount of the bid or gives the bidder an advantage or benefit not allowed other bidders. In other words, a public agency can only waive a deviation from bid specifications that is inconsequential and not material. A bid containing a material deviation must be rejected as non-responsive. See 47 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 129, 130 (1966); *Kovler*, supra, 206 Cal. App. 3d at 454; see also *Valley Creek Landscapes, Inc. v. City Council* (1996) 41 Cal. App. 4th 1432. Factors considered in determining whether a deviation is a minor irregularity or material departure include whether the deviation could be a vehicle for favoritism, affect the amount of the bid, influence potential bidders to refrain from bidding, or affect the awarding entity's ability to make bid comparisons. *Kovler*, supra, 206 Cal. App. 3d at 455.

In this case, SNC's violations of the Department's Bid Specifications and governing DBE regulations created an advantage for SNC not available to other bidders. The defects in its bid enabled SNC to claim more DBE participation than that to which it was entitled. In sum, SNC failed to satisfy the standards established in specifications and significantly oversteered its DBE participation. Such defects are material, give SNC a competitive advantage over other bidders, and render SNC's bid non-responsive. Because Granite submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid, it should be awarded the Contract.

The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) received a bid submitted by Granite Construction Company (Granite) for Contract No. 03-3F0304 on February 27, 2013. By this letter, Caltrans notifies Granite that its bid is nonresponsive because it revised column 4 on the Subcontractor List form.

The Subcontractor List form states in part, "...Complete columns 1 and 4 and submit with the bid. Complete columns 2 and 3 and submit with the bid or fax to (916) 227-6282 within 24 hours after the bid opening. Failure to provide complete information in columns 1 through 4 within the time specified will result in a nonresponsive bid."

On the original submitted Subcontractor List, Granite identified bid item 14, Street Sweeping to be performed by S.T. Rhoades Construction, Inc. However, on the second submitted Contractor List submitted on February 27, 2013, bid item 5, Portable Changeable Message Sign (LS) was added to columns 2 and 4 as additional work to be performed by S.T. Rhoades.

Based on the above, Caltrans will proceed to award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

Your attention is directed to Section 3-1.04 of the Amendments to the 2010 Standard Specifications. Caltrans is not obligated to offer an extension of the award period for a nonresponsive bid.
