As a valued member of the Caltrans team, you put safety first, you make it possible for the Department to improve the mobility across California by being innovative and flexible; working cooperatively with team members and others; and treating others fairly, honestly and with respect. Your efforts are important to each member of the team, as well as those we serve.

GENERAL STATEMENT:

Under the direction of a CT Maintenance Supervisor, the incumbent will assist the supervisor in planning and scheduling work, and in the field will oversee and lead the crew in highway maintenance work. Assume the duties of CT Maintenance Supervisor in his absence, do necessary paper work, training and planning the work of subordinates. Assist the Supervisor on accidents and spill emergencies. Set up road closures, detours, control traffic and cleanup as needed. Duties include paving, pot-holing and crack-sealing; drain and ditch cleaning, guardrail, fence, sign and delineation installation, maintenance and repair, brush and tree trimming, removal storm-deposited materials, snow and rocks and other related duties. Will be required to operate equipment which may include minor repair or adjustments and perform manual labor as needed. May be loaned to other cost centers. The incumbent will be expected answer emergency call-outs and may be required to work overtime including nights, weekends, and holidays. Will be assigned to temporary and/or intermittent work-shift changes due to weather or workload.

Work hours usually will be 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM. To help the Department with scheduling, incumbents may be asked to work alternate work shifts; such as but not limited to 9/80, 4/10 or night work, or switch to summer work hours of 6:30 AM to 3:00 PM based on crew assignment.

| 50% (E) | Work with and assist in the supervision of a crew engaged in the maintenance and/or repair of highways and highway structures including the repair of payment, shoulders, fences, signs, and guardrail. Cleans drains, removes rocks, snow, litter and debris from highway. During winter, assist in the planning, coordinating and direction of the crew involved in winter road condition operations. May also assist in maintaining highway rest areas. |
| 20% (E) | Operation of motor vehicles and other motorized equipment which may include making minor repairs or adjustments. |

- 15% (E) Assist the Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor on accident and spill emergencies. Set up road closures, detours, control traffic and cleanup work as needed.
- 15% (E) Assume the duties of the Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor, in his absence, doing necessary paperwork, training and planning the work of subordinates.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED OVER OTHERS

Acts as the Leadperson with a crew to carry out assignments made by the supervisor.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND ANALYTICAL REQUIREMENTS

- ◆ Must have knowledge of the methods, materials, tools and equipment used in the maintenance and repairs of highways and highway structures including pavement, shoulders, fence, signs and guardrail.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of the provisions of the California Vehicle Code as it applies to the operation of motor vehicles.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of the principles of effective supervision.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of safety practices and traffic regulations.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of the basic operational safety and health regulations in Title 9 Industrial Relations - Construction and General Industry Safety Orders.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of the safety and health policies and procedures as contained in the Department's Injury and Illness Prevention Program.
- ◆ Must have knowledge of basic safety work practices.
- ◆ Must know the Leadworker's role in the maintaining an effective Injury and Illness Prevention Program.
- ◆ Must have the ability to direct the work of others
- ◆ Must have the ability to keep time records and simple cost records of materials, equipment, and expenses.
- ◆ Must have the ability to assist in work relating to maintenance and landscape equipment including ability to make minor adjustments and repairs.
- ◆ Must have the ability to analyze situations accurately and take effective action.
- ◆ Must have the ability to deal with the public in a helpful and tactful manner.
- ◆ Must have ability to work with representatives from other departments and agencies.

CONSEQUENCE OF ERROR/RESPONSIBILITY FOR DECISIONS

When confronted with emergency situations, the Caltrans Highway Maintenance Leadworker judgement should consider the protection of lives, the environment and property. Improper safety practices could cause serious accidents or injury to self, co-workers or the traveling public.

The incumbent may be asked to work with California Highway Patrol representatives, other government agency representatives and members of the public as well as all levels of Caltrans Management.
