As a valued member of the Caltrans team, you make it possible for the Department to provide a safe, sustainable, integrated, and efficient transportation system to enhance California's economy and livability. Caltrans is a performance-driven, transparent, and accountable organization that values its people, resources and partners, and meets new challenges through leadership, innovation and teamwork.

GENERAL STATEMENT:

Working under the Supervision of Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor, operates specified vehicles requiring a valid Class B unrestricted California Commercial Driver's License with Tanker (N) endorsements and a current medical certificate that may be used by assigned unit. Works individually or with a crew performing tasks related to highway/landscape maintenance work. Workweek will be Monday through Friday, 0730 to 1600, 5/40 work schedule. The incumbent will be required to work overtime, work irregular shifts/alternate work schedules including nights, holidays and weekends; may be required to work temporary and/or intermittent varied work shifts and required to respond to emergency situations and calls. May be loaned to other cost centers. Must possess a Qualified Applicator's Certificate with Maintenance or Right of Way Category. This position is represented under collective bargaining. Duties include, but are not limited to:

TYPICAL DUTIES:

Percentage	Essential (E)/Marginal (M) ¹	Job Description
50%	E	Under the direction of the Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor, the Leadworker assists and coordinates with the Supervisor in the following: Conduct tailgate safety meetings. Ensure the employee and work zone procedures are followed as outlined in the Caltrans Injury and Illness Prevention Program, Chapter 8 of the Maintenance Manual and COSP. Assists the Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor in scheduling and planning work assignments. Lead crew in performance of maintenance activities as outlined in the Maintenance Manual Vol 1 Families A through G, J, M, S and R. Using as well as the training of employees in the use of, power equipment and various types of tools associated with highway/landscape maintenance. Able to transport a variety of objects less than or equal to 60 lbs. Recognize roadway deficiencies or public safety concerns and takes appropriate corrective action. Assumes the duties of Supervisor in the Supervisor's absence for a short duration.
35%	E	Operates light vehicles to heavy equipment identified as Category 2, used by the assigned unit, requiring a Class B Driver's License. Makes minor adjustments and emergency repairs to equipment, as well as servicing and maintaining equipment, (lube service points, change tires, light bulbs, fuses, filters, and window wipers; steam cleans equipment and operates hoist). Responsible for limited equipment qualification and on-the-job training (OJT).
10%	M	Provide traffic control for work area protection, for routine and emergency situations. Sets up and removes lane closures, traffic cones, flares and advance work signs; acts as a flag person; operates the pilot vehicles, backup truck, and lane closure truck; operates a two-way radio
5%	M	Generate computerized and written records, such as the IMMS daily timekeeping, and accident reports. Maintaining, ordering, receiving, and tracking supplies and materials in inventory stock. Maintain weekly fuel consumption reports, order fuel and provide accurate Recap reports monthly

¹ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS are the core duties of the position that cannot be reassigned.

MARGINAL FUNCTIONS are the minor tasks of the position that can be assigned to others.

SUPERVISION OR GUIDANCE EXERCISED OVER OTHERS

Under the direction of the Caltrans Maintenance Supervisor the Landscape Maintenance Leadworker assists and coordinates with the Supervisor in the following. Conducts tailgate safety meetings. Ensures the employee and work zone procedures are followed as outlined in the Caltrans Injury and Illness Prevention Program. Chapter 8 of the Maintenance Manual and COSP. Leads crew in the performance of Landscape maintenance activities as outlined in the Maintenance Manual Vol. 1. Training of employees in the use of hand and power tools and equipment and equipment associated with highway.

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KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES, AND ANALYTICAL REQUIREMENTS

Must have knowledge of Caltrans safety regulation. Must have the ability to analyze changes in laws, rules and regulations pertaining to storm water and be able to work with Supervisor to implement. Must be familiar with light and heavy equipment used in highway/landscape maintenance operations. Modern methods of materials and tools used in landscape irrigation repair and upkeep. Ability to operate heavy and light equipment used in highway/landscape maintenance and right of way clean up. Knowledge of laws and policies regarding maintenance and use of weed and pest control methods and materials in landscape and non-landscaped areas is required

Ability to communicate and follow directions at a level required for successful job performance; do heavy manual labors; keep records. Assists in working relating to the maintenance of highway, structure and landscaped areas.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR DECISIONS AND CONSEQUENCES OF ERROR

Poor decisions could result in the failure to properly service, maintain and/or operate equipment and cause excessive repair costs, loss of equipment and/or negatively impact work production. Negligence could also cause physical harm to the operator, crewmembers, and/or general public and expose the State to liability claims.

PUBLIC AND INTERNAL CONTACTS

The incumbent may be asked to work with other State and Local Agencies, members of the public as well as all levels of Caltrans Management.

PHYSICAL, MENTAL, AND EMOTIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The incumbent may be required to wear earplugs for loud noises; move heavy objects; stand or sit for prolonged periods. May also be required to bend, stoop or kneel. In the event of an accident involving vehicle drivers and/or hazardous spills, the incumbent may be required to assist in the cleanup. Must have ability to develop and maintain cooperative working relationships; respond appropriately to difficult situations; recognize emotionally charged issues or problems; and acknowledge the various responses.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

The incumbent may/will be exposed to high-speed traffic; loud noise; dust; chemicals; extreme weather conditions and great heights. Will be required to work rotating and irregular shifts, overtime due to storms, emergencies, or special work projects, nights, weekends, and holidays. This also includes responding to after hour call-outs, which can include working with other maintenance crews involved in traffic control, accidents or other emergency work.
