




Bayview Hunters Point

Project Summary:

The purpose of this study was to advance community-based solutions for transportation service in Bayview Hunters Point and to address significant mobility barriers faced by various community members. The study combined rigorous technical analysis with substantive community engagement which developed an implementable community-based transportation program through detailed planning.

Community Outreach

- A Transportation Working Group composed of representatives from community-based organizations and other interested community leaders was formed to consider alternative service models and to guide the development of a community-based approach to addressing transportation needs in the community.
- A survey was distributed to determine the interest of organizations in the area of participating in an innovative transportation pilot.

Environmental Justice Community Outreach:

- Specific stakeholders which were thought of during this project included school-age children and senior adults.

Project Outcome

- The product that evolved from this project is a revised Business Plan that should not be considered a final plan as it is a living document and will be revised to meet the community of Bayview Hunters Point's needs.
- The Business Plan builds on a long history of planning and community involvement around transportation issues in the study area. The Plan provides a detailed road map for implementation of the potential pilot vehicle-sharing project in the Bayview with a developed schedule, budget, and organized structure.

Successes & Next Steps

- As a result of the Transportation Working Group and from information gathered from past community-based events, a van-sharing pilot program was produced.
- The project empowered the community to take ownership of transportation issues in their community and to come together to implement the van-sharing pilot.
- A Community Advisory Board will be formed to help in writing grants, seeking other funding, and to continue communication with stakeholders within the community.
