Chapter: 1, 2 Page: 13-14, 20

Begin here:

Page 13-14, SB 743: add to first sentence, "for transit priority areas". SB 743 only says "may adopt guidelines, pursuant to Section 21083 establishing alternative metrics to the metrics uses for traffic levels of service for transportation impacts outside transit priority areas." The key word is MAY.

Page 20, first paragraph, Regions do not adopt land use plans, local agencies or entities with legal standing adopt land use plans. Remove "and land use plans" from the sentence.

General Comment - the CTP Guidelines appear to be so generic it is unclear exactly what will be covered under the plan.
