RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS

The Department of Transportation (Department) recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve Relinquishment Resolutions R-3482 - R-3484.

All superseded highways included in the relinquishment resolutions summarized below are in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described by the individual summaries.

R-3482 – 07-LA-5,210-PM 43.6/45.6,0.0/0.8 (Request No. 936) – 7 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Los Angeles, along Foothill Boulevard between Filbert Street and Sierra Highway, consisting of relocated or reconstructed city streets and frontage roads. Project accepted in April 1975. The City by freeway agreement dated October 17, 1967, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expired October 1, 2000.

R-3483 – 11-SD-52-PM 14.0/14.9 (Request No. 27212) – 4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Santee, between Big Rock Road to Fanita Drive, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city streets. The City by freeway agreement dated April 11, 1990, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. Project completed on October 9, 1999. The 90-day notice period expired May 25, 1998, without exception.

R-3484 – 12-Ora-39-PM 12.7/14.5 (Request No. 120001) – 13 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Buena Park, from the southern city limits to Orangethorpe Avenue, consisting of sidewalks. The City by cooperative agreement dated March 21, 2001, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
