**RESOLUTION FP-98-88**

**RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended the following Resolution be approved.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION

Resolved, that \$1,433,631 be allocated from Item 2660-101-0183 in the 1998 Budget Act for seven (7) Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation (EEM) projects.

**SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS**

This resolution allocates a total of \$1,433,631 in State funds for seven (7) EEM projects included in the approved project list.

The total cost of the EEM projects is estimated at \$6,051,956 including \$4,618,325 from other sources.

The statute mandates the Resources Agency to evaluate proposals and the CTC to award grants to fund proposals recommended by the Resources Agency. The 1998 EEM Program was adopted by the CTC on August 19, 1998.
