Ref: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **ISSUE:**

The facilities in the relinquishment resolutions summarized below are safe and drivable or have been maintained in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the California Transportation Commission (Commission) meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Department of Transportation recommends the Commission approve the following Relinquishment Resolutions:

### Resolution No. R-3612 – 5-SCr-1-PM 2.27 (Request No. 10069) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes a portion of Route 1 right of way in the County of Santa Cruz, at Harkins Slough Road, consisting of a bridge wingwall built and maintained by the County within State Right of Way. The County, by Resolution dated August 2, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

### Resolution No. R-3613 – 7-LA-2-PM 5.9/7.7 (Request No. 1191) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Beverly Hills, under terms and conditions as stated in the cooperative agreement dated July 19, 2005, determined to be in the best interest of the State. Authorized by Chapter 594, Statutes of 2003, which amended Section 302 of the Streets and Highways Code.

Resolution No. R-3614 – 8-SBd-30-PM 0.0/0.25 (Request No. 451S) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Upland, along the old alignment of State Route 30, from the westerly city limits to 0.25 mile east of the westerly city limits, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The City, by resolution dated September 9, 2002, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3615 – 12-Ora-73-PM 4.3 (Request No. 73006-R) – 4 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Irvine, at University Drive South, consisting of reconstructed and relocated city streets. The City, by cooperative agreement dated February 15, 2005, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
