Subject: **TECHNICAL CORRECTION TO PREVIOUSLY APPROVED RESOLUTIONS -
RESOLUTION FP-07-48**

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation (Department) recommends the California Transportation Commission approve a technical correction to Resolution FP-07-48, originally approved January 10, 2008, in the amount of \$30,960,000 for two State-Administered State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) projects on the State Highway System.

ISSUE:

A technical correction is needed for Project #2 – Near Salida, on Route 219 from Route 99 to Morrow Road (PPNO 9940B) to widen to four-lanes. Stanislaus Council of Government's 2006 Augmentation Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) identified the construction implementing agency as "Caltrans, Modesto, County." The 2006 STIP Augmentation specified Caltrans as the implementing agency. A cooperative agreement executed by the Department and the City of Modesto on October 16, 2007 identified the City of Modesto as implementing agency for construction. When the construction allocation was made in January 2008, the funds were inadvertently allocated to the Department. This technical correction changes the recipient to the City of Modesto.

In addition, this technical correction clarifies the project location. At the time of allocation, the following description was used: "Near Salida, on Route 219 from Route 99 to Morrow Road. Widen to 4-lanes." This is the description for Phase 1 (PPNO 9940). The correct description is: "Near Salida, on Route 219 at Dale Road. Widen to 4-lanes." The postmile limits are correct.

The required changes have been made to the original book item attachment for Project #2– Near Salida, on Route 219 from Route 99 to Morrow Road to widen to four-lanes. The changes are reflected in strikethrough and bold.
