Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolutions in the county where the facilities are located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facilities to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agencies identified in the summary. The facilities are safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3778 – 02-Teh-99-PM 18.0/18.2  
(Request No. 10465) – 3 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Tehama along Route 99 at 68<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Le Claire Avenue, consisting of reconstructed county roads. The County, by resolutions dated April 6, 2010 and August 24, 2010, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3779 – 05-SLO-227-PM R10.26/R13.97  
(Request No. 11309) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Luis Obispo on Route 227 (Broad Street, South Street, Higuera Street, and Madonna Road), from the southerly city limits to Route 101. The City, by resolution dated August 17, 2010, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. Authorized by Chapter 650, Statutes of 2004, which amended Section 527 of the Streets and Highways Code.

Resolution R-3780 – 12-Ora-55-PM 13.7  
(Request No. R120047) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Orange along Route 55 at Chapman Avenue, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated September 9, 1997 and by resolution dated June 22, 2010, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
