Overview

- Area – Approximately **1,515 square miles**
- 2010 Population – **514,453 people**
- Contains **2,700 miles** of roadways
- Consists of **9 cities**:
 - Ceres
 - Hughson
 - Modesto
 - Newman
 - Oakdale
 - Patterson
 - Riverbank
 - Turlock
 - Waterford
- **Sixth** largest agricultural producing county in California
- Part of the San Joaquin Valley Air District







Open to Public: 2018


