5	Executive Director's Report	1.3	<p>Executive Director Rhinehart reported that a meeting was held on July 1, 2009 to discuss the process to update the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Guidelines in response to Senate Bill (SB) 375. Approximately 200 stakeholders attended the meeting. Speakers and panel members included respected and recognized leaders in transportation, air resources, land use and housing. The meeting was broken into three panels to provide state agency perspectives, regional planning perspectives, and environmental, land use and building industry perspectives. Associate Deputy Director Susan Bransen went on to report that two subcommittees will be formed as a result of the July 1 RTP Guidelines meeting--an RTP Guidelines subcommittee to focus on SB 375 language and guidance needed for successful implementation of SB 375, and a Modeling subcommittee to build upon the modeling guidance development in response to Assembly Bill 32 and adopted in the 2008 RTP Guidelines Addendum.</p> <p>Deputy Director Maura Twomey provided a brief overview on the Commission's second Town Hall meeting held June 24 in Eureka. The meeting was organized by the Humboldt County Association of Governments and included presentations from the Del Norte Local Transportation Commission, the Lake County Area Planning Council, the Mendocino Council of Governments,</p>	



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			<p>and the Trinity County Transportation Commission. The presentations focused on key issues for the region, including rural road rehabilitation, tribal transportation, non-motorized transportation, goods movement, and the interrelationship between transportation and economic stability and growth.</p> <p>Executive Director Rhinehart closed her report with an update on the upcoming Tri-State Commission Meeting (with Oregon and Washington State Transportation Commissions). She indicated that the Commission's delegation will meet with representatives from the other participating Commissions on July 22-24. Topics will include goods movement, transportation funding, and transit.</p>
