TEA PROGRAM AMENDMENT
Resolution G-01-18
Amending Resolution G-00-14

SUMMARY

This amendment transfers the applicant status of the project from the California Department of Health Services (DHS) to the Regents of the University of California (U.C. Regents). The project was adopted in the first round of the Statewide Transportation Enhancements (STE) share of the Transportation Enhancement Activities Program. It was adopted by the California Transportation Commission (Commission) in June 2000.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Resolution G-01-18, amending Resolution G-00-14, the adoption of the first round of the STE Program, be approved. Resolved, that the Commission revises the 1998/99 STE Program as shown below:
