Dear Ms. Kiser and Mr. Sukys:

With this letter, I am transmitting Administrative Modification No. 20 to California's 2008/09-2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP), which makes minor modifications to the FSTIP. Please note that Recovery Act funds are included on one project in this modification. The following grouped project listings are included in this modification:

- **Bicycle Pedestrian Facilities Nonattainment Areas (BIKEPED).** Three projects are added to this grouped project listing: The West Point Bike Trail in Calaveras County is funded with \$59,402 of Recovery Act Transportation Enhancement funds in Fiscal Year (FY) 2009/10. The Ridge Road/Zion Street pedestrian/bicycle project in Nevada County is funded with \$200,000 of Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) funds and \$27,000 of local match in FY 2009/10. The State Route 49 crossing and East Broad Street Sidewalk project is funded with \$40,000 of CMAQ and \$5,200 of local match in FY 2009/10 and \$124,000 of CMAQ and \$16,100 of local match in FY 2010/11. The three projects increase the total funding in the BIKEPED grouped project listing by approximately \$472,000 or 19 percent.
- **National Scenic Byways (SCENICBYW).** One new project is added to this grouped project listing. The Ebbetts Pass Organizational Development Grant #3 is added in FY 2001/11. The project is funded with \$65,000 of National Scenic Byways funds and \$16,000 of local match. The total funding for this grouped project listing is increased by \$81,000 or approximately 10 percent.

These changes are submitted as an administrative modification. The changes are within the quadrennial element; do not reflect a change in the design concept or scope of the project, or impact financial constraints. Funding is available for these modifications. In

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addition, there are no projects in this Administrative Modification No. 20 that are included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review.

Since administrative modifications do not require Federal Highway Administration and/or Federal Transit Administration approval, this FSTIP modification has been amended into California's 2008/09-2011/12 FSTIP.
