Dear Ms. Kiser and Mr. Sukys:

With this letter, I am transmitting Administrative Modification No. 22 to California's 2008/09-2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP), which makes minor modifications to the FSTIP. Please note that this modification includes adjustments to projects funded with American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Recovery Act) funds. The following projects are included in this modification:

- SR 89/Union Pacific Rail Road Grade Separation. High Priority funds in Fiscal Year (FY) 2008/09 are moved to prior year and are increased by \$452,000. Local funds are also increased by \$120,000 in prior year.
- Recreational Trails Grouped Project Listing. A Plumas County project, Plumas Back Country Discovery Trail Maintenance, is added in FY 2009/10. Total funding is increased by \$175,400 in FY 2009/10.
- Death Valley Scenic Overlook. The construction costs are increased to include support costs. An additional \$129,000 is added to the construction phase.
- State Highway Operations and Protection Program (SHOPP) Collision Reduction Grouped Project Listing. Construction costs of \$1,000,000 for a minor project located in Mono County are added in FY 2009/10.
- SHOPP Bridge Preservation Grouped Project Listing. The construction costs will now be funded with Recovery Act funds. There are no changes in total project costs.
- Pavement Rehabilitation and Intersection Improvements, Grouped Project Listing for Non Attainment Areas. Two new Nevada County projects funded with local funds are added to this listing in FY 2009/10.
- Eastern Sierra Scenic Byway. Recovery Act funds are removed from this project. Recovery Act funding will be used for a project in the Planting Grouped Project listing.


- Grouped Project Listing for Planting and Landscaping. This modification adds two new projects: Lee Vining Streetscape in Mono County, and Sutter Hill Transit Center Phase V in Amador County. A total of \$224,000 in Recovery Act funds is programmed for these projects.
- Grouped Project Listing or Bicycle Pedestrian Facilities, Attainment Areas. Adds \$60,000 total funding for a new Colusa County project, Hall Street Pedestrian Safety Walkway, in FY 2009/10.

These changes are submitted as an administrative modification. The changes are within the quadrennial element; do not reflect a change in the design concept or scope of the project, or impact financial constraints. Funding is available for these modifications. In addition, there are no projects in this Administrative Modification No. 22 that are included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review.

Since administrative modifications do not require Federal Highway Administration and/or Federal Transit Administration approval, this FSTIP modification has been amended into California's 2008/09-2011/12 FSTIP.
