Dear Ms. Kiser and Mr. Sukys:

With this letter, I am transmitting Administrative Modification No. 47 to California's 2008/09-2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP), which makes minor modifications to the rural, non-MPO portion of the FSTIP. These changes are submitted as an administrative modification. The changes are within the quadrennial element; do not reflect a change in the design concept or scope of the project, or impact financial constraints. Funding is available for these modifications. In addition, there are no projects in this Administrative Modification No. 47 that are included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review. Modifications are made to the following five projects:

- Purchase Transit Vehicles, Tuolumne County. The provision of the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 permitting the increase of federal share of Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) funded projects up to 100 percent is in effect through December 31, 2010. As a result, this modification removes \$49,000 of local funds and increases the CMAQ funds by the same amount.
- BIKEPED – Bicycle Pedestrian Facilities Grouped Project Listing for Non Attainment Counties. This modification reduces the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act of 2009 (ARRA) funding for the Penn Valley Drive Bike Trail in Nevada County by \$8,500. The savings from this project will be applied to the La Barr Meadows project in the grouped project listing for Pavement Rehabilitation and Intersection Improvements for Non Attainment Counties.
- BIKEPED2 – Bicycle Pedestrian Grouped Project Listing for Attainment and Nonclassified Areas. This modification increases funding for the Lake County Lakeshore Bikeway project by \$14,000 of ARRA RSTP. These funds are the result of savings from the City of Lakeport project in the Preventative Maintenance grouped project listing.
- PREVMANT – Preventative Maintenance Title 23, 771.117, Grouped Project Listing. This modification decreases the ARRA RSTP funding for the City of Lakeport project by \$14,000 due to cost savings. The savings are applied to the Lakeshore Bikeway project.
- RRRBTBL2, Grouped Project Listing for Pavement Rehabilitation and Intersection Improvement for Non Attainment Counties. This modification adjusts funding between projects within the grouped


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project listing. In addition, the La Barr Meadows project is increased by \$8,500 of ARRA Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) funds.

Since administrative modifications do not require Federal Highway Administration and/or Federal Transit Administration approval, this FSTIP modification has been amended into California's 2008/09-2011/12 FSTIP.
