SUBJECT: AMBAG 2004/05-2006/07 FSTIP AMENDMENT NO. 5

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have completed our reviews of Amendment Number 5 to the Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments (AMBAG) portion of the 2004/05-2006/07 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) that was submitted by your letter dated April 11, 2005. As detailed in the enclosure to your letter, this amendment modifies 17 projects and deletes 4 projects listed in the MTIP/FSTIP in the counties of Monterey, San Benito and Santa Cruz. The AMBAG Board of Directors endorsed this amendment to the FY 2004/05-2006/07 Monterey Bay Area Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) on April 2, 2005, by approving Resolution No. 2005-6. We are approving this amendment to the 2004/05-2006/07 FSTIP for the AMBAG region pursuant to the Federal statewide and metropolitan transportation planning regulations codified in 23 CFR Part 450, and in accord with the July 15, 2004, *Memorandum of Understanding between the Federal Highway Administration, California Division, and the Federal Transit Administration, Region IX.*

We find that the AMBAG 2004/05-2006/07 MTIP, including Amendment No. 5, was developed through a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process in accord with the metropolitan transportation planning provisions of 23 USC §134 and 49 USC Chapter 53. We have determined that the adopted modifications to the AMBAG MTIP proposed for inclusion in California's FSTIP by this amendment are exempt from the regional emissions analysis and conformity determination requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Transportation Conformity Rule as amended. Our transportation planning and air quality conformity findings have been coordinated with the regional offices of the U.S. EPA and Federal Transit Administration (FTA). This FSTIP Amendment approval is provided with the understanding that FTA funding approval on the individual projects contained in the FSTIP are subject to grantees meeting all necessary FTA administrative requirements.
