**SUBJECT: 2004 FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (FTIP)  
ADMINISTRATIVE AMENDMENT # 15 –Modify a project within the FTIP**

Dear Ms. Falsetti:

As the Executive Director for the Stanislaus Council of Governments, I hereby approve **Administrative Amendment # 15** to the 2004 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) to move the dollar amounts within the following previously programmed project:

1. **CMAQ: The City of Modesto, Construct Right Turn Lanes - Three Locations. CML-5059 (134)** Move \$100,000 (\$88,530 Fed/\$11,470 Local) in Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program Funds, From the Right of Way Phase to the Preliminary Engineering Phase.

**REASON:**

1. The City of Modesto requests to move the previously programmed \$88,530 of Federal Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program (CMAQ) funds and \$11,470 of Local funds from the Right of Way phase of the project to the Preliminary Engineering phase of the project. The projects can be completed within the existing right of way.


This amendment meets the criteria for changes that may be made administratively (Type 1):

- No new projects have been added;
- Included projects do not affect the air quality conformity determination;
- The implementation of Transportation Control Measures (TCM) has not been adversely affected;
- The StanCOG FTIP remains financially constrained, Fund changes remain within existing projects and the current triennial element; and
- No scope changes have resulted.

This administrative amendment will be forwarded to Caltrans for review and information. Since this amendment was accomplished administratively, a resolution from the Stanislaus Council of Governments Policy Board is not required.
