**SUBJECT: Formal Amendment #1 to the 2007 Federal Transportation Improvement Program**

Dear Ms. Falsetti:

Enclosed for your review and approval is the documentation for Formal Amendment #1 to the 2007 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP).

The projects proposed in Amendment #1 conform to the applicable SIPs and meet all the applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450. The proposed projects are determined to be exempt from the conformity determination requirement per 40 CFR 93.126. Because the proposed projects are exempt, no further conformity determination is required. The addition of the projects does however require a formal amendment. The proposed projects do not interfere with the timely implementation of any approved TCMs. The 2007 FTIP as amended meets all the applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450.

A 30-day public comment and review period was completed with a public hearing held October 25, 2006. No significant comments were received. On October 26, 2006, the SJCOG Board approved FTIP Amendment #1. State and federal approval is required.

FTIP Amendment #1 amends SJCOG's 2007 FTIP to add the following projects:

FTIP Amendment #1

FTIP Amendment #1 adds the following projects in SJCOG's 2007 FTIP:

- 1) San Joaquin Regional Transit District's new Regional Operations Facility Project (PPNO #0140, CTIPS ID#212-0000-0352) Programs \$1,300,000 in STIP funds for the environmental (PA&ED) phase in FY 2006-07.

2) City of Lodi's new Municipal Service Center (MSC) Transit Vehicle Maintenance Facility project (PPNO 0139, CTIPS ID#212-0000-0351) Programs \$1,850,000 in STIP funds for construction of the facility in FY 2007/08.

3) San Joaquin County Minor A Construction Program (CTIPS ID#212-0000-0353) Programs \$1,106,000 in Caltrans Minor Program funds for the San Joaquin County lump sum listing of the Minor A Program.

FTIP Amendment #1 amends the following project in SJCOG's 2007 FTIP:

4) Emergency Repair Program (CTIPS ID#212-0000-0307) Changes fund type to Emergency Repair-State. Funds remain the same on this project.

**RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT #1 TO THE 2007 FEDERAL  
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (FTIP)**

WHEREAS, the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) is a Regional Transportation Planning Agency and a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), pursuant to State and Federal designation; and

WHEREAS, the Federal government requires MPOs to prepare, adopt, and maintain a Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) consisting of a three-year program of projects for federal funding assistance; and

WHEREAS, the current FY 2006/07 to FY 2008/09 FTIP, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination were federally approved October 2, 2006; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain a current and accurate FTIP, amendments are needed periodically; and

WHEREAS, FTIP Amendment #1 adds the following projects to the 2007 FTIP: San Joaquin Regional Transit District's new Regional Operations Facility Project (PPNO 0140, CTIPS ID#212-0000-0352) which programs \$1,300,000 in STIP funds for the environmental (PA&ED) phase in FY 2006-07; City of Lodi's new Municipal Service Center (MSC) Transit Vehicle Maintenance Facility project (PPNO 0139, CTIPS ID#212-0000-0351) which programs \$1,850,000 in STIP funds for construction of the facility in FY 2007/08; San Joaquin County Minor A Construction Program (CTIPS ID#212-0000-0353) which programs \$1,106,000 in Caltrans Minor Program funds for the San Joaquin County lump sum listing of the Minor A Program; and

WHEREAS, FTIP Amendment #1 changes the following project in the 2007 FTIP in FY 2005/06: Emergency Repair Program (CTIPS ID#212-0000-0307). This amendment changes the fund type to Emergency Repair-State. The dollar figures remain the same; and

WHEREAS, as amended, the projects included in FTIP Amendment #1 are exempt from Air Quality conformity requirements; and

WHEREAS, as amended, the FY 2006/07 to 2008/09 FTIP is financially constrained and the financial plan affirms that funding is available; and

WHEREAS, as amended, the FY 2006/07 to 2008/09 FTIP remains consistent with the 2004 Environmental Impact Report; and

WHEREAS, the amendment does not interfere with the timely implementation of the Transportation Control Measures; and

WHEREAS, the amendment was circulated for a 30-day public review and comment period, with a public hearing held October 25, 2006; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the San Joaquin Council of Governments approves formal Amendment #1 to the 2007 Federal Transportation Improvement Program; and
