SUBJECT: MCAG FY 2012/13-2015/16 FTIP Amendment # 27

Dear Ms. Falsetti:

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have completed the review of Amendment # 27 to the Merced County Association of Governments (MCAG) FY 2012/13-2015/16 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) that was submitted by your letter dated October 3, 2014. MCAG Amendment # 27 was adopted by the MCAG Board with Resolution No. 2013/09-25-01 on September 25, 2014. This amendment to MCAG's 2013 FTIP programs the following project MCAG's 2013 FTIP:

The 2013 FTIP Formal Amendment 27 adds two Active Transportation Program (ATP) projects.

- **(205-0000-0244):** In Merced State Highway 59 Multi-Use Path: The project is located along State Highway 59 generally between Cooper Avenue and 16th Street. The project purposes to install a 1400 foot long multi-use pathway on the east side of State Highway 59. The CTC has awarded \$958,000 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2015/16 for completing environmental and design and for construction.
- **(205-0000-0245):** In the Community of Winton, Merced County. Walnut Avenue Complete Street Upgrade: The project is located along Walnut Avenue between Santa Fe Drive and Winton Way. The project is to upgrade Walnut Avenue to enhance safety and to provide for an improved functional use by pedestrians and bicyclists. The project includes infrastructure and non-infrastructure components. The CTC has awarded \$236,200 in FY 2014/15 for completing environmental and design, and \$1,545,000 in FY 2015/16 for construction. Merced County will also be funding construction with \$398,000 of local monies. Total project cost= \$2,179,000.

Pursuant to the July 17, 2004, *Memorandum of Understanding between the Federal Highway Administration, California Division, and the Federal Transit Administration, Region IX*, we accept the modifications to the 2012/13 – 2015/16 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) for the MCAG region in accordance with the *Final Rule on Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning* published in the February 17, 2007 Federal Register. We find that the MCAG's FTIP, through Amendment # 27, was developed through a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process carried out in accordance with the metropolitan planning provisions of 23 U.S.C. 174, and 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 as amended by Sections 1201, 1202, 20005 and 20006 of Public Law 112-141, the Moving Ahead for Progress is the 21st Century Act (MAP-21).

We have determined that this program modification is exempt from the regional emissions analysis requirements pursuant to the transportation conformity provisions found in 40 CFR Part 93. This finding has been coordinated with Region 9 of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in accordance with the procedures outlined in the *National Memorandum of Understanding between DOT and EPA on Transportation Conformity*, dated April 25, 2000. Therefore, we find that the FTIP continues to conform to the applicable State Implementation Plan (SIP).


This approval is provided with the understanding that the FTA funding approval on the individual projects contained in the FSTIP are subject to grantees meeting all necessary FTA administrative requirements, and that approval of this programming action does not provide a federal eligibility determination for Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) projects or any other project funding source included in this amendment.
