Dear Mr. Hannon and Mr. Sukys:

With this letter, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) transmits Administrative Modification No. 30 to the rural non-Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) area portion of the California 2013 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). This modification adds programming capacity in the amount of \$8.456 million that relies on the State's federal programming capacity. The financial plan will be updated to reflect this change in the next formal amendment.

FSTIP Modification #30 amends the following existing projects in the 2013 FSTIP:

State and Local Elements:**Various Counties:**

Proj #1: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0066, Grouped Project for Safety Improvements – State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) Collision Reduction – modifies the funding and adds various 2014 SHOPP projects on the detailed backup listing totaling \$5.221 million.

Proj #2: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0029, Grouped Projects for Emergency Repair – SHOPP Emergency Response – modifies the funding and adds one project on the detailed backup listing totaling \$3.135 million in FY 13/14.

Proj #3: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0067, Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements – SHOPP Mobility – modifies the funding in FY 14/15 and 15/16 with no change in total project cost and updates the detailed backup listing.

Proj #4: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0400, Grouped Project Listing for Training and Research Programs – increases the funding in FY 13/14 by \$100,000 and adds one project on the detailed backup listing funded from federal discretionary Highway Research and Development Program (HRDP).

Proj #5: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0395, Grouped Projects for Activities that do not lead to construction – Statewide Highway Bridge Program (HBP) – modifies the funding between FYs to match the Caltrans HBP listing update as of April 2, 2014.

Calaveras County:

Proj 6-10: Modifies the delivery schedule of five individually listed HBP projects to match the Caltrans HBP listing update as of April 2, 2014. No change in total cost.

Inyo County:

Proj #11-12: Modifies the delivery schedule of two individually listed HBP projects to match the Caltrans HBP listing update as of April 2, 2014. No change in total cost.

Mariposa County:

Proj #13-16: Modifies the delivery schedule of four individually listed HBP projects to match the Caltrans HBP listing update as of April 2, 2014. No change in total cost.

Nevada County:

Proj 17-19: Modifies delivery schedule of three individually listed HBP projects to match the Caltrans HBP listing update as of April 2, 2014. No change in total cost.

These changes are consistent with the FSTIP Amendment and Administrative Modification Procedures and have no impact on the rural non-MPO financial constraint or air quality conformity. In addition, there are no projects in this administrative modification that are included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review.

Since administrative modifications do not require Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and/or Federal Transit Administration (FTA) approval, these changes have been incorporated into California's 2013 FSTIP.
