Dear Ms. Falsetti:

With the delegation authority provided me by the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency (SRTA) Board of Directors (per attached SRTA Resolution #13-14, dated December 10, 2013), I hereby approve Formal Amendment No. 8 to the FTIP for forwarding to Caltrans for review and recommendation of approval to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

The amendment is consistent with metropolitan transportation planning regulations per Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 450. As amended, the 2013 FTIP is financially constrained and the enclosed financial summary confirms that funding is available. Additionally, the amendment is consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan. Shasta County is in conformance with federal air quality standards.

The amendment notification process complies with SRTA's adopted Public Participation Plan. The public review period was open from Friday, January 31 through Tuesday, February 18, 2014, exceeding the requisite two-week review. The changes are as follows:

- **Grouped Projects for Safety Improvements—Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), CTIPS ID (211-0000-0093):**
 - This amendment adds two new projects in the City of Redding for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2015/16 and beyond:
 - At various locations along Victor Ave. between Enterprise Park and Churn Creek Road (HSIP6-02-001) – Reduce travel lanes, install and raise median islands, pedestrian pathway and lighting for a total estimated cost of \$1.416 million.

- On Old Oregon Trail between Midland Drive and Bear Mountain Road (HSIP6-02-002) – Widen shoulder and upgrade drainage for a total estimated cost of \$1.888 million.
- This amendment adds two new projects for the county of Shasta for FFY 2015/16 and beyond:
 - On Deschutes Road between Balls Ferry Road and Beatie Road (HSIP6-02-003) – Widen and pave shoulders for a total estimated cost of \$1.5 million.
 - On Deschutes Road between Beatie Road and Brundage Road (HSIP6-02-004) – Widen and pave shoulders for a total estimated cost of \$1.5 million.
- Additionally, this amendment modifies four other bridge projects from the CT HQ HSIP Backup List Update dated May 1, 2013 to the one issued on November 15, 2013 with either year changes in funding, or additional funding. These projects are HSIP4-02-002, HSIP4-02-004, HSIP4-02-003, and HSIP5-02-004. The programming revisions are included together in the summary of changes spreadsheet.
- Finally, this amendment changes the project limit description of HSIP5-02-003 from Gas Point Road between Keri Lane and Charles Street to Gas Point Road between Ludwig Gulch and Michael Street.

WHEREAS, the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency (SRTA) has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Shasta County pursuant to U.S.C. Section 134(a) and (g); and

WHEREAS, Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 450 requires the preparation and adoption of a four-year Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) by the MPO to become part of the Federal-Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP); and

WHEREAS, in order to be consistent with the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), the FTIP must be updated every two years; and

WHEREAS, SRTA is responsible for preparing and processing administrative modifications and formal amendments to the FTIP; and

WHEREAS, SRTA's governing board of directors may delegate approval of formal amendments to the FTIP to the executive director of SRTA; and

WHEREAS, the meeting schedule of the SRTA Board of Directors can make it difficult to bring forward formal FTIP amendments in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Shasta Regional Transportation Agency delegates authority from the SRTA Board of Directors to the executive director to approve formal amendments to the FTIP under the following criteria:

1. Programming revisions will be consistent with federal and state allocations, and prior SRTA actions;
2. Federal and state FTIP requirements would continue to be followed, as well as SRTA's public participation process; and
3. The executive director will postpone and refer to the SRTA Board of Directors any amendment where such a request is made during the public participation process.
