Subject: Actual Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2007/08 Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) Apportionments.

Final distribution of RSTP apportionments for FFY 2007/08 is attached for your information. These apportionments are made in accordance with Sections 182.6(b) of the California Streets and Highways Code (S&H).

Distribution is based on Federal Notice 4510.672, Supplementary Tables released on February 27, 2008, pursuant to the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), and the continuing appropriations resolution.

The final adjusted RSTP totals for 2007/08 reflect a two percent set aside for State Planning and Research, and a deduction for the Transportation Enhancement Program. The distributions include the pro-rata distribution of Equity Bonus fund as specified in Title 23 United States Code (USC), Section 105(c).

The RSTP totals reflect a pro-rata \$500,000 deduction for the Cooperative Training Assistance Program (CTAP). The CTAP is a state-local subsidized training program for public employees in the transportation field and administered by the University of California. Information regarding training courses, available through CTAP, may be obtained by contacting the Institute of Transportation Studies at (510) 231-9590.

The RSTP apportionments comply with S&H Code 182.6(d), which requires RSTP apportionments to equal or exceed 110 percent of FFY 1990/91 Federal-Aid Secondary funding, and to equal or exceed FFY 1990/91 Federal-Aid Urban funding adjusted by population.

Unobligated Balances


